

## 2025 Report - Introduction:

Season's greetings to our esteemed donors, partners, fundraisers, and community volunteers.

At the Yeti Paul Foundation, every impact we record is a story of shared purpose. We are deeply grateful to our grantees, donors, partners, educators, and community members whose unwavering commitment made it possible for us to continue advancing education, empowerment, and community service throughout 2025. In a year defined by uncertainty, your support enabled us not only to endure—but to lead, innovate, and serve.

As we look ahead, we remain inspired by what collective action can achieve and confident in our ability to deepen impact in the years to come.

## A Challenging Humanitarian Landscape:

The year 2025 unfolded against a backdrop of significant disruption within the global humanitarian sector. Substantial reductions in U.S. government funding led to a sharp decline in grants and programmatic support for Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) interventions across Nigeria. These cuts disproportionately affected local organisations tasked with sustaining services at the community level. For indigenous charities like the Yeti Paul Foundation, the consequences were immediate. As donor-funded projects were discontinued or scaled back, service gaps widened, placing increased responsibility on local Charities to respond with limited financial and technical resources.

## The Challenge

The funding shortfall triggered a ripple effect across the WASH ecosystem, with direct consequences for vulnerable populations, including:

- Reduced investment in water infrastructure, such as borehole construction and rehabilitation.
- Limited support for sanitation improvement and hygiene promotion initiatives.
- Declining resources for awareness-raising, behavior change communication, and youth engagement on water conservation and hygiene practices.

For the Yeti Paul Foundation, these systemic challenges translated into:

- Growing demand for community education and advocacy without commensurate funding growth.
- Increased reliance on modest internal resources and voluntary contributions.
- Constraints in sustaining existing programmes and expanding outreach to underserved communities.

Yet, in the face of these constraints, resilience became our response.

## Resilience in Action: Our Way Forward

We believe that strengthening indigenous institutions is essential to ensuring that WASH and education interventions remain responsive, inclusive, and community-driven—especially in periods of declining international aid.

## First Aid Awareness Training:



The Foundation officially launched its 2025 programmes with a First Aid Awareness Training Workshop on January 27, 2025. This initiative reflected our commitment to practical education, safety, and community preparedness.

Led by distinguished facilitators, the workshop engaged students and educators in identifying hazards, assessing risks, and responding effectively to emergencies. Participants were taken beyond theory through hands-on training—learning lifesaving skills such as CPR and basic wound management.

To strengthen sustainability, the Foundation donated first aid and medical supply kits to representatives from eight (8) participating schools, enhancing their capacity to respond to emergencies and safeguard student wellbeing.

## Supporting Higher Education and Knowledge Development:



During the year, the Foundation also expanded its commitment to higher education through a new partnership with Aletheia University, Ago-Iwoye, Ogun State. To support academic learning and research, the Foundation donated a collection of accounting reference books to the university's library, contributing to the development of a strong academic foundation for students and faculty alike.

This investment reflects our belief that access to quality educational resources is fundamental to long-term social and economic transformation.

## “Water as a Life Resource” Debate

December 11, 2025, the Yeti Paul Foundation organised the **“Water as a Life Resource” Debate**, bringing together young students to engage critically with one of the most urgent development challenges of our time—access to safe and sustainable water.

Designed as a youth-centered advocacy and learning intervention, the debate used dialogue and critical thinking to deepen understanding of water's role in public health, sanitation, economic resilience, and social cohesion. Students emerged not only informed, but empowered as advocates for water stewardship and WASH awareness within their schools and communities.



Outstanding participants and schools were recognised through certificates, financial awards, and scholarship support.

## Looking Ahead: What to Expect in 2026:

Building on lessons learned and partnerships strengthened, the Foundation plans to focus on the following priority areas in 2026:

1. Provision of basic classroom infrastructure to improve learning environments.
2. Collaboration with international organisations to expand access to WASH services in low-income communities.
3. Scholarship support for vulnerable students to advance educational attainment.
4. Advocacy for gender equity, diversity, and inclusion in access to WASH services.
